Full time Year Round Senior Park Aide will soon be ours!

The LWSC and the Bridle Trails Park Foundation are joining forces and dollars to increase our financial support to State Parks to ensure that we will have a quality, experienced and full time Senior Park Aide ALL YEAR LONG!!! In the past, the State has funded a portion of the year, and our club, and the BT Park Foundation have jointly funded an additional 4 months. This left a gap during the winter, when our full time Ranger had no dedicated Park Aide, which meant that when large trees came down, it could take a while to get the manpower to the park for cutting and removal. (State Park safety rules dictate that there always be at least two trained staff members for chainsaw operations). State Parks is currently searching for the right candidate, and she/he will start in April. This funding decision was carefully considered by the LWSC Board, and was felt to be an excellent expression of our club's mission of supporting Bridle Trails State Park.

However, they have had a bit of a rough existence, lacking in the kind of storage such aging documents need. Enter the Eastside

Heritage Center. We have reached out them and they have offered to house and care for our club's historical documents in the loving and respectful way they need, and make them available to anyone who wishes to 'visit' them. To support their curatorial efforts on behalf of our scrapbooks, and their general mission of preserving Eastside history, the LWSC Board voted to donate \$1000 to accompany the loan of our scrapbooks. We may also be contracting with them to provide a display of the material at our Annual Meeting and Awards Banquet in November this year.

The pages of our scrapbooks were also painstakingly digitally photographed by Jim Erckmann from the Bridle Trails Park Foundation (Thank You Jim!) and the digital files will be provided to the Eastside Heritage Center. The Eastside Heritage Center has created an online database of their digital material. At some point in the future, we hope that our scrapbook material will be available from their database. In the meantime, there is a lot of wonderful stories and maps and information to peruse. EXPLORE!



- Attendance at the first couple of Hunter/Jumper Shows to process membership applications.

However, in order to improve security, the state parks will be making a couple of operational changes: The bathrooms will be locked after dark with lights extinguished, and they are looking into ways to improve security in the parking lot. Ideas include an automated gate to eliminate vehicle access off hours and placing emphasis on having a volunteer camp host reside at the park (there is an RV spot at the end of the parking lot).

Ride a Test for Feedback! Sunday April 22nd at BTSP

The Lake Washington Saddle Club and Equestrian Institute are co-sponsoring a Ride-a-Test Fund-raiser for the USDF Region 6 Youth Program.

Sunday, April 22, 2018 at Bridle Trails State Park \$135 per rider, (remember, it's a fund-raiser!)

Riders, this is your chance to Ride Your Test and then discuss it with the Judge -- a "Ride-A-Test" Schooling Show/Clinic. LWSC and EI have joined forces to help fundraise for the Region 6 Youth Programs by offering this opportunity.

You start by RIDING your test in the Dressage Arena before one of our two judges, Kari McClain, "S" Judge from Olympia or Paula Kierkegaard, "R" Judge from Redmond.). After riding your test, you'll go up to the judge's box and discuss the test -- what was good, what could be better. You'll then go back to the warm-up area and work with one of the volunteer trainers (or your own trainer if you wish) on one or more of the issues highlighted by the judge (not too long but long enough to perhaps fix a thing or two). Then back before the same judge to ride the same test and see if you've made an improvement. Each ride "session" will be 12 minutes to allow time to talk with the judge and will give you time (about 25 minutes) to work with the trainer between the first and second ride.

These judges are donating their time:

Kari McClain, from Olympia, a well known USEF "S" Judge who judges all around the US and is currently working on her FEI Judges License. She is also the owner and primary trainer at her barn, Miari Stables in Olympia. Oh, and she was one of the very first to ride in the Young Riders Program (just a few years ago!).

Paula Kierkegaard, from Redmond, is a long time USEF "R" judge who judges and clinics around the US. Amongst many other things and awards, Paula was co-editor and author of the original USDF Instructor/Trainer Manual.

Classes Offered:

As this is a Schooling Show, just about any Dressage Class you want to ride can be offered including Freestyles and Eventing Classes (YES, you Eventers out there -- take this opportunity to work "in the sandbox" which is how you win!). However, USEF Training - Fourth Level and FEI PSG, I1, I2 and Grand Prix in addition to all levels of Freestyles will be offered.

Cost -- This IS a Fund Raiser, your fee of \$135 gets you: Two rides, time with your Judge and work with one of our FEI Level Trainers on issues highlighted by the judge. AND best of all, supports the USDF Region 6 Youth Program!
