- **Non-Members:** \$3.00 more a class for Non-Members and \$40.00/youth and \$50/adult unlimited.
- Most gaming classes will have two divisions, an open division and a walk/trot division.

- 27) Rescue Ride:** First rider rides bareback to the second rider, the first rider helps the second rider get on, the two riders.
- 28) Bareback Ride-a-Buck (Adult):** Riders put a dollar bill between their leg and the horse and perform various maneuvers. If the bill falls they are eliminated. Last remaining rider keeps all the dollar bills. Ride back together (THIS IS DONE BAREBACK).
