Entries

- **NEW FOR 2018:** If you are entering online, please input your credit card information directly into horseshowtime.com. If you are entering via paper entries, please submit a check for the deposit.
- **NEW FOR 2018:** Closing date for entries is the Friday 1 week prior to the show. *Late entries incur a \$5 per class post entry fee.*
- Entries must be fully filled in and accompanied by a \$50 deposit and all stall fees to be considered complete. This means indicating the classes you intend to enter as well! If you do not submit the deposit prior to the close date, your entry will be considered late and you will be charged a \$5 late fee per class.
- Fee for using a credit card is \$20 per entry. There is no fee if paying by check.
- Please renew membership online prior to the first show. There is a \$30 show pass fee for non-members.

- The show office is open on Fridays from 12pm to 6pm. We strongly recommend checking in and getting your number on Friday, even if you do not plan to stable at Bridle Trails. This speeds up the show mornings for the office.

Stabling

- **NEW FOR 2018:** Stabling is available for \$35 per day. Stalls are available at 12pm on Friday for Saturday use and at 4pm on Saturday for Sunday use. Priority is given to completed entries based on date received.
- Shavings are available from First Fruits Feed. Please order through the form on our website and call First Fruits directly to pay.
- Tack stalls are available as space allows and for trainers with 6 or more horses. Priority given to horses staying the full weekend and to horse use first. It is h

Ring 1

- **NEW FOR 2018:** Start high, finish low. On both Saturday and Sunday we are starting with our highest heights and finishing with the lower levels. Seniors still will ride before juniors.
- **NEW FOR 2018:** Mini Prix (presented by Burkwood Farm) and Hunter Derby (presented by Cascade Horse Shows) will be the first class of the day.

Ring 2

- **NEW FOR 2018:** "Not to start before" times are implemented for crossbars and 18". Crossbars will not start before 11am and 18" will not start before 1am.
- **NEW FOR 2018:** The 0.60m, 0.65m, and 18" divisions will include light fill in all jumps (flowers, gates, panels).
- In jumpers, ground poles through 0.65m features 3 optimum time rounds per division. Ground poles has an optimum time of a "quiet trot" and cross bars and up feature an optimum time of a "brisk trot with some cantering"

Schooling

- Schooling will be available to LWSC members on Friday night (12pm-dusk), Saturday night (once the new course is set), Saturday and Sunday mornings from 6:30-7:45am, and during the show in the warm-up arena.
- 15 minute schooling breaks in Ring 2 at each height change (between ground poles and crossbars, and again between crossbars and 18") for participants to safely warm up.

Jumper Tables

- There will be three rounds at each height for jumpers as well as a champion and reserve in each division.
- Table 2 Sec 1 - "Speed" - timed first round, no jump-off. Winner is fastest time with least faults.
- Table 2 Sec 2(b) - "Jump-off" - First round untimed, stay in ring and begin jump-off within 45 seconds if clear. Winner is fastest time with no faults in the jump-off.
- Table 2 Sec 2(c) - "Power and Speed" - First portion of round is untimed, if no faults, continue without stopping on to timed section. Winner is fastest time in second portion with least faults.

Medals Series presented by Thumbs Up Farm

- Two round Medals class with a ride off at each show. Round 1 is a flat phase, Round 2 is a fences phase (2'6"), and top four riders are invited back for a ride-off.
- Each phase is entered separately and pinned separately.
- Winner of the LWSC Medal is the rider with best combined score in Round 1, Round 2, and ride-off.
- Riders do NOT need to participate in both rounds - but must if competing for the overall medal.
- Series is open to all juniors and amateur adults. Professionals not permitted.

Exhibitor Parties

- Starting at 11am each show Saturday, we will have an exhibitor party in the picnic area of the main arena.

Volunteering and Year End Awards

- Our shows are entirely volunteer run. We cannot exist without the help of our volunteers and encourage all participants to help out as they are able.
- We need announcers, ribbon room gals, and lots of jump crew - there is a job for everyone.
- Members who earn 8 volunteer hours are eligible for year-end awards at our banquet.
- Setting the course on Friday afternoon, Saturday afternoon, or Sunday evening is worth 4 hours, regardless of actual time taken!
