



2019 SHOW SEASON UPDATES

Entries

- **NEW FOR 2019:** All entries must be submitted online with a credit card payment for the deposit (\$50) and applicable stall fees. Entries submitted without a credit card will not be considered.
- **NEW FOR 2019:** There is no credit card fee for entries this year, however the mandatory fee (office, disposal, schooling) has increased to \$50.
- **NEW FOR 2019:** To ride in September, the RIDER must have competed at an LWSC HJ show in 2019.
- Closing date for entries is the Friday 1 week prior to the show. *Late entries incur a \$5 per class post entry fee.* We anticipate shows filling prior to this closing date, so get your entries in early.
- Entries must be fully filled in and accompanied by a \$50 deposit and all stall fees to be considered complete. This means indicating the classes you intend to enter as well! If you do not submit the deposit prior to the close date, your entry will be considered late and you will be charged a \$5 late fee per class.
- Please renew membership online prior to the first show. There is a \$30 show pass fee for non-members.

- The show office is open on Fridays from 12pm to 6pm. We strongly recommend checking in and getting your number on Friday, even if you do not plan to stable at Bridle Trails. This speeds up the show mornings for the office.

Stabling

- **NEW FOR 2019:** Stabling is available first come first served and will be assigned by the order in which entries were received. We have 40 permanent, roofed portable stalls and 6 temporary stalls with no roofs available to use. The 40 permanent stalls will be filled first and then the 6 temporary stalls will be filled. This means barns may be slightly separated within the stabling blocks.
- Stalls are available at 12pm on Friday for Saturday use and at 4pm on Saturday for Sunday use.

- Shavings are available from First Fruits Feed. Please call First Fruits directly to pay.

Ring 1

- **NEW FOR 2019:** We will run the 0.95 and 1.0m classes first on Saturday, then go back down to 0.70m and build up to the 0.90m classes. On Sunday we will start with the 3' and then go down to 2'3" and build up to 2'9". Medals will run between the 2'6" and the 2'9" divisions
- Mini Prix and Hunter Derby will be the first classes of the day

Ring 2

- **NEW FOR 2019:** 2' will now be run in Ring 2. Jumps will be condensed for flat classes and split to canter as necessary. Canter is expected in 18" and 2' but not in the ground poles or crossbars.
- "Not to start before" times are implemented for crossbars, 18", and 2'. Crossbars will not start before 11am, 18" will not start before 12pm, and 2' will not start before 1pm.
- All divisions above ground poles will include light fill in all jumps (flowers, gates, panels).
- In jumpers, ground poles through 0.65m features 3 optimum time rounds per division. Ground poles has an optimum time of a "quiet trot" and crossbars up features an optimum time of "brisk trot w/some cantering"

Schooling

- Schooling will be available to LWSC members on Friday night (12pm-dusk), Saturday night (once the new course is set), Saturday and Sunday mornings from 6:30-7:45am, & during the show in the warm-up arena.
- 20 minute schooling breaks in Ring 2 at each height change (between ground poles and crossbars, and again between crossbars and 18") for participants to safely warm up outside of the Ring 1 warm-up area.

Jumper Tables

- There will be three rounds at each height for jumpers as well as a champion and reserve in each division.
- Table 2 Sec 1 - "Speed" - timed first round, no jump-off. Winner is fastest time with least faults.
- Table 2 Sec 2(b) - "Jump-off" - First round untimed, stay in ring and begin jump-off within 45 seconds if clear. Winner is fastest time with no faults in the jump-off.
- Table 2 Sec 2(c) - "Power and Speed" - First portion of round is untimed, if no faults, continue without stopping on to timed section. Winner is fastest time in second portion with least faults.

Medals Series presented by Jennifer Hallman and Derek Luhn

- Two round Medals class with a ride off at each show. Round 1 is flat, Round 2 is fences (2'6"), and the top four riders are invited back for a ride-off. Each phase is entered separately and pinned separately.
- Winner of the LWSC Medal is the rider with best combined score in Round 1, Round 2, and ride-off.
- Riders do NOT need to participate in both rounds - but must if competing for the overall medal.
- Series is open to all juniors and amateur adults. Professionals not permitted. Past series winners exempt.

Exhibitor Parties Sponsored by WSHJA

- Starting at 8am each show Saturday, we will have a continental breakfast available near the main arena.

Volunteering and Year End Awards

- Our shows are entirely volunteer run. We cannot exist without the help of our volunteers and encourage all participants to help out as they are able.
- Members who earn 8 volunteer hours are eligible for year-end awards at our banquet.
- Setting the course on Friday afternoon, Saturday afternoon, or Sunday evening is worth 4 hours, regardless of actual time taken!
