



# 2021 SHOW SEASON UPDATES

The 2021 LWSC Hunter/Jumper Show team would like to thank you for your continued support of our grassroots, fun, and affordable horse-show series!

Each year we try to improve how we do things based upon direct feedback from our members and attendees. We endeavor to remain flexible with the times and needs of our patrons. 2020-2021 have been unprecedented years and require flexibility, patience, a sense of humor, and kindness from all of us. Our desire each year is to make things run even more smoothly while increasing our offerings and benefits to participants.

## Entries

- **NEW FOR 2021:** Closing date for entries is 11:59 pm the Friday **2 weeks prior to the show**. *Late entries will still incur a \$5 per class post entry fee.* We anticipate shows filling prior to this closing date, so get your entries in early.
- Entries must be fully completed online. They must be accompanied by a \$50 deposit and all stall fees to be considered complete. This means indicating the classes you intend to enter as well! If you do not submit the deposit prior to the close date, your entry will be considered late, and you will be charged a \$5 late fee per class. Entries submitted without a credit card will not be considered. There is no credit card fee for entries.
- The mandatory fee (office, disposal, schooling) remains \$50 and covers administrative costs associated with shows.
- To enter the September show, the RIDER must have competed at an LWSC H/J show in 2021.
- Please renew membership online prior to the first show. There is a \$30 show-pass fee for non-members.

- The show office is open on Fridays from 12pm to 6pm. We strongly recommend checking in and getting your number on Friday, even if you do not plan to stable at Bridle Trails. This speeds up the show mornings for the office.

## Stabling

- **NEW FOR 2021:** Due to state COVID-19 restrictions, we have some unique conditions that are being placed upon our facility and ability to host shows. One of the primary constraints is that we are only allowed to have 50% capacity of our parking lot. To allow for as many haul-in riders as possible, ALL trailers bringing horses who are using stalls must leave the facility by 8pm on Friday night and may not return to pick horses up until after 3pm on Sunday.
- **There will be NO passenger vehicle parking on site.**

Until capacity constraints are lifted, stalls at our shows will be assigned by priority using the following criteria:

1. Current LWSC Membership
2. Show staff and full weekend volunteers
3. Distance traveled and need to stay in hotels
4. Attendance AND class entry for both days

5. Inability to haul in and out daily (IE trainers with multiple loads of horses using the same trailer)
6. Priority of one show weekend vs another

- Please fill out the **2021 Trailering and Stabling Form** to the best of your ability. We will use it to guide decision making regarding stall assignments AND when we need to close entries. If you were one of the winners at the 2019 LWSC Banquet for a stall, it will be automatically assigned to you for all four shows. Shavings, grain & hay are available from First Fruits Feed (425-867-9800) or Snohomish Co-Op (360-568-2104). Please complete their online forms to arrange payment and delivery.

### Ring 1

- **NEW FOR 2021:** We will run the 0.95 and 1.0m classes at the **END** of the day Saturday. On Sunday we will start with 2'3" and finish with 3'0". Medals will run between the 2'6" and 2'9" divisions.
- Mini Prix and Hunter Derby will be the first classes of the day at the September show only.

### Ring 2

- Both Saturday and Sundays begins with Senior Cross Bars and end with 0.65m Saturday and 2' on Sunday. There are NO Ground Pole classes at Classic H-J shows (only at Academy H-J shows).
- 2' will be run in Ring 2. Jumps will be condensed for flat classes and split to canter as necessary. Canter is expected in 18" and 2' but not in the ground poles or crossbars.
- All divisions above ground poles will include light fill in all jumps (flowers, gates, panels).
- In jumpers, ground poles through 0.65m features three optimum-time rounds per division. Ground poles has an optimum time of a "quiet trot" and crossbars up features an optimum time of "brisk trot w/some cantering"

### Schooling

- Schooling will be available to LWSC members on Friday night (12pm-dusk), Saturday night (once the new course is set), Saturday and Sunday mornings from 6:30-7:45am, & during the show in the warm-up arena.
- 20-minute schooling breaks in Ring 2 at each height change (after each of the crossbars and 18" divisions) for participants to safely warm up outside of the Ring 1 warm-up area.

### Jumper Tables

- There will be three rounds at each height for jumpers as well as a champion and reserve in each division.
- Table II, Sec 1 - "Speed" - timed first round, no jump-off. Winner is fastest time with least faults.
- Table II, Sec 2(b) - "Jump-off" - First round untimed, stay in ring and begin jump-off within 45 seconds if clear. Winner is fastest time with no faults in the jump-off.
- Table II, Sec 2(c) - "Power and Speed" - First portion of round is untimed, if no faults, continue without stopping on to timed section. Winner is fastest time in second portion with least faults.

### LWSC Medals Series presented by Brass Ring Farm

- Two round Medal class with a ride off at each show. Round 1 is flat, Round 2 is over fences (2'3" - 2'6"), and the top four riders are invited back for a ride-off. Each phase is entered, scored, and pinned separately.
- Overall winner of the LWSC Medal is the rider with best combined score in Round 1, Round 2, and ride-off.
- Riders do NOT need to participate in both rounds - but must if competing for the overall medal.
- Series is open to all juniors and amateur adults. Professionals not permitted. Past series winners may not enter.

### Volunteering and Year End Awards

- Our shows are entirely volunteer run. We cannot exist without the help of our volunteers and encourage all participants to help as they are able.
- Members who earn 8 volunteer hours are eligible for year-end awards at our banquet.
- Setting the course on Friday afternoon, Saturday afternoon, or Sunday evening is worth 4 hours, regardless of actual time taken!

### FREE Fun Classes at EVERY SHOW (time permitting)!
