## First Obstacle Training and Challenge Event - April 11th

Robin Foster is once again hosting these events. A variety of "interesting" objects and challenges will be set up around the arena, and you will be free to experiment with and experience them at your own pace in a safe and supervised environment.

Due to Covid restrictions, attendance needs to be closely managed. As a result, three trail obstacle open ride times are available (9am - 11am, 11am - 1pm, 1pm-3pm) with up to 10 horse/rider pairs during each time window. Tickets prices will be \$10.00 per time window and must be paid in advance during online registration. Most important to keep in mind is that PRE-REGISTRATION IS REQUIRED, AND IT CLOSES APRIL 9TH. ## **Hunter/Jumper News**

Hello from your excited-for-spring H/J Show Team!

As we are writing this, there is a hint of blue sky and sunshine, which makes it a perfect day for us to check in with you on our upcoming show season. First, we ARE on track to have a show season in 2021! We do have to make some changes to account for the COVID restrictions, but we know you are as excited as we are to get back into the ring.

This year, we are planning again to have two show series: Classic Hunter/Jumper (4 shows) and Academy Hunter/Jumper (3 shows). Please visit our website (<a href="www.lakewashingtonsaddleclub.org">www.lakewashingtonsaddleclub.org</a>) to learn more about these show series and see if one of them is right for you.

Due to COVID, we have some unique restrictions that are being placed upon our facility and ability to host shows. One of the primary constraints is that we are only allowed to have 50% capacity of our parking lot. To allow for as many haul-in riders as possible, ALL trailers bringing horses who are using stalls must leave the facility by 8pm on Friday night and may not return to pick horses up until after 3pm on Sunday.

Stalls for the Classic H/J shows, until COVID restrictions are lifted, will be assigned by priority using the following criteria:

- 1. Current LWSC Membership
- 2. Show staff and full weekend volunteers
- 3. Distance traveled and need to stay in hotels
- 4. Attendance AND class entry for both days

- 5. Inability to haul in and out daily (e.g. trainers with multiple loads of horses using the same trailer)
- 6. Priority of one show weekend vs another

Registration this year is a two-part process.

- Go to <u>www.lakewashingtonsaddleclub.org/hunterjumper.html</u>, and scroll down to the 2021 Trailering and Stabling Form. You MUST fill out this form for your HorseShowTime entry to be valid!
- 2. When the show entry opens on HorseShowTime, and you have already filled out the form in step 1, you may complete your registration.

We are looking forward to seeing you in the show ring!

Wear your mask, wash your hands, and enjoy the sunlight peeking through the clouds.

#### **New Mounting Blocks**

As many of you may have noticed, there are some new mounting blocks strategically placed within Bridle Trails State Park. In the past the Park Ranger has fashioned mounting blocks out of fallen logs but it was decided that a more durable option was needed. The logs decay and get rather "tippy" so LWSC did some research and found a mounting block option that we hope blends into the Park since they are green and will be durable since they are heavy duty plastic. They are three step and are taller than typical mounting blocks. So far people seem pleased with them. They have been placed at the sound end of the parking lot, near the barn, at the powerline arena and also at a number of entrances along 60<sup>th</sup> and 132<sup>nd</sup> for those riding in. The mounting blocks have also been placed next to the two new benches on the Trillium Trail. The mounting blocks are funded by LWSC and installed by our Park Rangers, we hope you find them useful.
